The French Language Program

Our 4-semester elementary and intermediate French sequence -- 1101, 1102, 2101, 2102 -- will be offered in the Fall, Spring and Summer semesters. So will 3405 (3rd-Year Grammar and Composition) and 2106 (Rapid Reading and Translation).

There will be no special 2101 and 2102 sections reserved for SIPA students this year (but of course SIPA students are welcome to enroll in any of our classes).
